Exploring Childhood Studies - CALL FOR PAPERS

The Lion and the Unicorn's special issue on Children's Literature and Climate Change

Marek Oziewicz, University of Minnesota and Lara Saguisag, College of Staten Island-City University of New York (Guest Editors).

Deadline to August 20, 2020.

We seek essays on how children's literature empowers young people to productively engage with the challenges of climate change. After decades of climate change denial and toothless mainstream response, young people are angry. In response to climate change illiteracy and the impotence and negligence of adult-led institutions, teenage activists such as Xiuhtezcatl Martinez and Greta Thunberg are calling for radical and immediate action. Their voices are now being amplified by millions of adults, who discovered during the pandemic that they are expendable in a system that considers unlivable wages, unaffordable healthcare, underfunded education, unwholesome food, unregulated destruction of the planet, and mass sacrifice of all life to be an acceptable price for the benefit of the few in the ecocidal "market economy". How does children's literature and media stoke this transformative anger and inspire young people to address the climate crisis and fight for their fundamental rights to life, health, and sustenance? How can educators and scholars of children's literature support this fight? What new concepts, approaches, and narratives are needed to accelerate the sociopolitical revolution that will dismantle the status quo of slow violence against all life on the planet, or what Amitav Ghosh calls "the Great Derangement"? In this issue, we intend to bring together innovative research on children's literature that attends to multiple facets of climate change and advances a conversation about the planetary future we can and want to create.

Conference theme: Give more power to the people

VIRTUALLY because of COVID-19

Call for Proposals: New Submission deadline is june 1, 2020

The Program Committee for the 2020 Annual Meeting of the History of Education Society, in collaboration with the Society for the History of Children and Youth (shcy.org), invites proposals on all topics related to the history of education, in any period or nation, and especially proposals that cross cultures, periods, or national boundaries. SHCY will sponsor panels at this conference and its members are encouraged to attend.

The 2020 Annual Meeting occurs days after this year's Presidential election, and marks several key anniversaries relevant to the history of education, including the 400th anniversary of the arrival of The Mayflower; the 150th anniversary of the 15th Amendment that gave African American males the right to vote; the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment that gave women the right to vote; the 50th anniversaries of the Chicano Movement, the Red Power Movement, the Black Power Movement, the Gay Rights Movement, the Women's Equal Rights Movement, and the rise of Ethnic Studies programs in higher education, the 40th anniversary of A People's History by Howard Zinn, and the 25th anniversary of Ayers v. Fordice (1995).

The central theme of the History of Education Society (HES) 2020 Conference in Baltimore is "Give More Power to the People". Arguably no space or place in public life has this theme been more present than in the field of education. Everyday people demanding access, equality, equity, inclusion, democracy, empowerment, leadership, courage, and change have reshaped the educational landscapes of their respective societies for centuries.

This year's conference recognizes the power everyday people have had on the transformation of schools and society.

- All proposals are welcome, but we particularly encourage submissions on the following areas:
- Global Democracies, Citizenship-Making and Education as a Fundamental Right
- Social and Cultural Movements in Education
- Indigeneities
- Innovations and Problematics in Research Methodologies
- The Role of Social Foundations in Building Civil Societies
- Reconsiderations of Theory and Historiographies

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Proposals can take one of four forms: (a) an individual paper, (b) a complete session, (c) a panel discussion, or (d) a workshop.


